



Tenure Line Faculty Position – Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Professor

Criteria: Candidates must have an earned research doctorate in nursing or a related field. Licensed registered nurses are strongly preferred. Candidates should have evidence of scholarly publications in refereed journals and demonstrated ability to generate extramural funding in one or more of the priority areas. Candidates are strongly recommended to have completed post-doctoral studies in their field of interest. Academic rank and salary will be commensurate with qualifications.
